



Sing! Stomp! Act! Fall 2017 workshop stirred excitement

In the Fall of 2017 Alex Haunty's Theater and Arts Fund, Inc. joined hands with Inspiring Hope Studio, a branch of Inspiring Hope Ministries to do creative art workshops for young adults with disabilities. Alex invited his teachers Bobbette Rose (visual artist), Wendy Rowe (voice professor at UW Milwaukee), Lynda Sharpe (theater instructor), and Rachael Peterson (dance instructor with Breakthrough Dance Company) to help create a pilot workshop to explore song, dance, art and drama together. AHTAFI funded the professionals to help develop each learning module and Inspiring Hope Ministries, led by Mary Beth Haunty, provided the workshop space, food and peer mentors, together creating opportunities for people with disabilities to grow in the arts, have fun and build relationships. Our plan is to continue to develop this integrated model into an ongoing community endeavor.



Where Broadway takes us in 2018

In 2018, we are inviting young adults with disabilities to *American in Paris* and *Les Misérables* at the Overture Center for the Arts. We are taking new groups and their helpers and are also hosting some preparatory opportunities to help prepare our guests for these experiences. We plan to continue to sponsor pre and post events that celebrate and extend the theater experience, allowing our guests to connect with each other about the show as well as give them opportunities to interact with the Broadway cast. We invite individuals to consider sponsoring a show reception and be a part of the event.
